




# ACICIS' Journalism Professional Practicum (JPP)

Placing well-rounded interns within Jakarta-based institutions

## What is ACICIS?

The Australian Consortium for 'In-Country' Indonesian Studies (ACICIS) is the longest running provider of in-country Indonesian study programs for Australian students and the primary mechanism through which Australian students pursue study in Indonesia for academic credit.

From small beginnings as a facilitator of accredited in-country Indonesian language study, ACICIS' program offerings have grown to include semester-long and six-week professional practicum programs in a range of disciplines, including journalism, development, business, law, and international relations.

ACICIS is a consortium of twenty-five Australian member universities (including all of the Group of Eight) as well as overseas centres-of-excellence

## What does the JPP offer host organisations?

Via a careful selection process, ACICIS aims to provide Host Organisations with excellent interns with prior practical experience in the media and communications sector. JPP students can assist your organisation with:

- ◆ Working in the field with local counterparts to cover breaking news;
- ◆ Assisting in the design and editing of online news content;
- ◆ Pitching stories and preparing news content for a variety of media;
- ◆ Research assistance and data collection for features;
- ◆ Tape logging and voice-over work for English news broadcasting;
- ◆ Assisting with media and communication strategies.

## How to participate as a Host Organisation

- ◆ By hosting one or more ACICIS JPP interns in your organisation, or;
- ◆ Via in-kind support through the provision of speakers, networking events and/or venue support, or;
- ◆ Through tailored sponsorship packages.

## What is the JPP?

- ◆ A six-week intensive academic and vocational study program for high-achieving upper undergraduate Australian and international Journalism and media and communications students;
- ◆ Students undertake two weeks of intensive language learning and industry-led seminars on the Indonesian media and journalism sector;
- ◆ Students then complete a four-week industry internship placement with a participating Australian or Indonesian organisations;
- ◆ Students are selected on a strictly competitive-entry basis, with

## JPP Host Organisations & Placement Options

Host Organisations will be drawn widely from Jakarta's media and journalism sector, including:

- ◆ Radio & television;
- ◆ Newspaper;
- ◆ Business & Finance magazines;
- ◆ News magazines;
- ◆ Feature & lifestyle;
- ◆ Online news, and;
- ◆ International organisation's communications department.

Students are assigned an English-speaking mentor in the workplace to guide them through the four-week period.

The JPP Program Officer together with ACICIS' Jakarta Program Coordinator are assigned for the duration of the JPP to oversee all aspects of the JPP.
