

## About ACICIS

- A consortium of 27 universities, including 25 Australian universities, Leiden University in the Netherlands and SOAS, University of London, in the UK.
- Enables students to undertake study for credit at Indonesian universities, in a safe, secure and supportive environment.
- Established in 1994 to overcome academic, bureaucratic, and immigration impediments that had prevented Australian students from studying at Indonesian universities. Prior to the establishment of ACICIS, virtually no Australian student had undertaken study in Indonesia for credit.
- Governed by a National Reference Group, and coordinated by a Secretariat based at the University of Western Australia in Perth, Western Australia.
- ACICIS has helped over 2,000 students from Australia and abroad attend universities in Indonesia and complete professional internship modules.
- Has staff in Yogyakarta, Jakarta, Bandung, Bogor and Perth

## Achievements

- The Asian Studies Association of Australia has proposed consortia following the ACICIS model be established to support students of Arabic, Hindi and Vietnamese.
- In 2008 the Australian Learning and Teaching Council (ALTC) presented ACICIS with a sought after national award for 'Programs that Enhance Student Learning'.
- In 2009 ACICIS founder and Director Professor David T. Hill was awarded a sought after ALTC National Teaching Fellowship to develop a national strategic plan for the rejuvenation of Indonesian language teaching at Australian universities.
- In 2012 ACICIS was highlighted in the 'Australia in the Asian Century' White Paper as a 'successful model for in-country learning'.
- In the 2015 Australia Day Honours, Consortium Founder and Director, Professor David T Hill, was inducted as Member of the Order of Australia for his services to education and the bilateral relationship between Indonesia and Australia.
- In 2017 ACICIS secured \$1.9 million in New Colombo Plan funding to support students studying in Indonesia.
